The Greater-than-Moses Prophet Feeds a Multitude (6:1-14) 61 After these things Jesus went away across the Sea of Galilee (the Sea of Tiberias). 2 And a large multitude was following Him, because they had seen His signs that He was doing on the sick. 63 And Jesus went up on a mountain and He sat there with His disciples. 4 Now Passover, a feast for Judeans, was near. 65 Therefore lifting His eyes and seeing a large multitude that came to Him, Jesus said to Philip, "Where will we buy loaves, so they may eat?" 6 Now He said this to test him, for He knew what He was about to do. 67 Philip answered Him, "Two hundred denarii worth of loaves are not enough for them, so each of them might receive a little." 68 One of His disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, told Him, 9 "Here is a young boy who has five barley loaves and two small fish—but what are these for so many?"

6<sub>10</sub> However, Jesus said, "Make • the people recline." Now that place had much grass. So the men (numbering about five thousand) reclined.

6<sub>11</sub> Now Jesus took the loaves, and after giving thanks He dispensed them to the disciples, and the disciples to those reclining. Likewise also of the small fish, as much as they wanted.

6<sub>12</sub> Now when they were full, He told His disciples, "Gather • the leftover pieces so nothing may be wasted."

What's the big deal about not wasting pita bread here?

6<sub>13</sub> So they gathered *them* and filled twelve baskets with pieces of the five barley loaves that were left over by those who had eaten.

6<sub>14</sub> Therefore seeing the sign that Jesus did, men were saying, "This really is the Prophet, the *One* coming into the world."

## The LORD Delivers His Disciples from the Sea (John 6:15-21)

6<sub>15</sub> Therefore when Jesus knew that **people** were about to come and seize Him, so they might make Him king, He withdrew alone onto the mountain.

 $6_{16}$  Now as evening came, His disciples went down to the sea,  $_{17}$  and upon boarding the boat, they were going across the sea to Capernaum. Now darkness had already come, but Jesus had not come to them.

 $6_{18}$  Then the sea was billowing, because a strong wind was blowing.  $_{19}$  So after rowing about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat. And they were afraid.

6<sub>20</sub> But He told them, "I am, do• not be afraid." Exodus 3:14

 $6_{21}$  So they wanted to receive Him into the boat. And at once the boat was at the shore, where they had been going.
