John 5:2 says, "There is a pool"

John's silence about ministry to Gentiles suggests an early date Alleged instances of ministry to Gentiles: The Samaritan woman and her village (John 4:1-42)
The royal official (John 4:46-54)
Other sheep that are not part of this flock (John 10:16)
Greeks who came up to Jerusalem at Passover to worship (John 12:20-22)
This suggests that John was written before Acts 10 (Cornelius) = A.D
John likely wrote after Caiaphas was removed from the office of High Priest = A.D
Who Were the Original Recipients of John's Gospel? They were unbelievers
They were Jews
They were of the Diaspora
They had "tourist" knowledge of the land of Israel

They had familiarity with the Old Testament and Jewish religious practices
